Slug Control Plan Evaluation Form

Introduction

Per 40CFR 403.8 (f)(2)(v), the South Essex Sewerage District must evaluate whether each significant industrial user (SIU) needs a plan to control slug discharges. A slug discharge is any discharge of non-routine, episodic nature, including but not limited to an accidental spill or a non-customary batch discharge. More specifically, a slug discharge is any non-routine discharge that has the potential to cause interference or pass through or in any way violate the District's Sewer Use Regulations or any condition in an industry's wastewater discharge permit.

The District has set policy that any SIU who meets one or more of the following criteria must prepare and keep current a Slug Control Plan:

- A. has experienced an accidental spill; or
- B. has experienced a non-customary batch discharge; or
- C. has experienced any discharge of water or wastewater which in concentration of any given constituent or in any quantity of flow exceeds for any period of duration more than 5 times the allowable average 24-hour concentration or flows during normal operation and which may adversely affect the POTW or public sewer; or
- D. has experienced a release of liquids from a large vat, vessel, or container into the POTW or public sewers in such a manner:
 - (i) causing harm or threat of harm to the POTW or public sewers, workers or receiving water; or
 - (ii) exhibiting concentrations of pollutants in excess of the requirements of these regulations; or
 - (iii) causing a violation of any federal or state permits issued to the District.
- E. has had a release to the sewerage system of any pure chemical or mixture containing a chemical listed in Table 302.4 of 40 CFR 302 above the designated reportable quantity and is not permitted to do so. (For this criterion the reportable quantity is evaluated for a single release without regard to the length of time of the discharge to the sewerage system) or,

All Slug Control Plans shall contain the following minimum components:

- A. Description of discharge practices including non-routine batch discharges.
- B. Description of stored chemicals, including chemical names, quantities typically stored (in containers of 5 gallons or 50 pounds and greater; or stored in total quantities of twenty gallons or two hundred pounds or greater at any one time), storage locations, methods of delivery and transfer.
- C. Procedure for immediately notifying the District of a slug discharge, including any discharge that would violate a prohibition under 40 CFR 403.5 (b), with procedures for follow-up written notification within twenty-four hours.
- D. Procedures to prevent adverse impact from accidental spills, including inspection and maintenance of storage areas, handling and transfer of materials, loading and unloading operations, worker training, building of containment structures, measures for containing materials and equipment for emergency response.
- E. Plan of facility identifying chemical storage and manufacturing areas; including floor drains in these areas.
- F. A certification statement attesting to the implementation of the slug control plan.

If a plan is required, the District encourages that the plan be incorporated into a facility's existing environmental response or similar plan as required by other federal and state regulations, if practical and/or available.

To evaluate if your firm is required to submit a Slug Control Plan or if your current plan is acceptable, the District requests that you answer the questions on the next page every two years.
